CHURCH OPENING AND MASS TIMES

There are two Masses each Sunday: at 9.30am and at 11.00am. We thank parishioners for observing the following guidelines:

*The church is divided into two pods, and stewards are on hand to count parishioners in and guide you as to where to sit, so we can maximise the number who can attend while ensuring all safety measures are observed.

*We ask parishioners to wear a face mask while attending Mass and to sanitise your hands using one of the dispensers available as you enter the church.

*Holy Communion is brought to you by the celebrant or an assisting minister.

*Follow the guidance of stewards in exiting the church at the end of Mass.

The church remains open each day from 11.00am-5.00pm for private prayer.

Reflection: *'I want to urge you in the name of the Lord, not to go on living (an) aimless kind of life...you must put aside your old self.....so that you can put on the new self that has been created in God's way'. Thus begins St. Paul's words to the Christians at Ephesus in this Sunday's Second Reading. It is how the early Church understood the meaning of Baptism. Indeed as part of the baptismal liturgy to this day, the newly baptised is wrapped in a white blanket or shawl in keeping with Paul's words to the Galatians: 'You have put on Christ' (Gal. 3:27). Following the government's easing of restrictions this week, we are delighted that we can at last begin to celebrate the sacrament of Baptism this weekend. Many families have been waiting for nearly a year to mark this important step in their own and their child's faith journey. For the time being we will celebrate baptisms individually and outside Sunday Mass time in keeping with public health guidelines. Let us keep in our thoughts and prayers all those parents who will be presenting their children for baptism in the coming weeks.*
