**CHURCH OPENING AND MASS TIMES**

There are now two Masses each Sunday: at 9.30am and at 11.00am. The Mass at 9.30am will include some elements *as gaeilge*, including one of the readings. We respectfully remind parishioners of the following guidelines:

\*The church is divided into two pods, and stewards are on hand to count parishioners in and guide you as to where to sit, so we can maximise the number who can attend while ensuring all safety measures are observed.

\*We ask parishioners to wear a face mask while attending Mass and to sanitise your hands using one of the dispensers available as you enter the church.

\*Holy Communion will be brought to you by the celebrant or an assisting minister.

\*Please follow the guidance of the stewards in exiting the church at the end of Mass.

The church remains open each day from 11.00am-5.00pm for private prayer.

**Reflection:** *As anyone who has ever walked part of the Camino de Santiago will know, travelling light is not just a Gospel ideal. It is a practical necessity! You are carrying your rucksack all day as you walk, so anything that is not absolutely necessary gets gradually discarded. Jesus injunction to the Twelve to take nothing with them for the journey – 'no bread, no haversack, no coppers', is not simply an invitation to trust in God's providence and other people's generosity. It's also an invitation to take life as it comes. If the past year has taught us anything, it is that we are not as in control of things as we like to think. While that can be very inconvenient at times, there is a certain freedom in coming to terms with disappointment: with postponed birthday or wedding celebrations. While many of us are anxious to know when we can start dining indoors again or plan a holiday abroad, or when we will get our vaccine, maybe we just need to accept that these things will happen in good time. When we remember that we are more fortunate than many and have much to be grateful for, our lives can become a blessing for others. 'So they set off...and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them'.*
