Archbishop Dermot Farrell has launched the first phase of the Building Hope Initiative, which invites every parish in the diocese to participate in creating a diocesan plan for the future. The goal of Building Hope is to encourage us as a faith community to assess our pastoral strengths and resources for working in closer partnership with other parishes, in order to reach out more effectively to others. The chairperson of the Leadership Group, Ciaran Coll, will address parishioners at Mass this Sunday 15th May and invite everyone to a parish gathering in the parish centre immediately after 11.00am Mass on Sunday 29th May. Parishioners are invited to read the Archbishop's Easter Pastoral Letter, the Statement of Mission, the parish profile, the parish partnerships' timeline and the Building Hope Prayer, all of which are posted on the noticeboard in the church and on our parish website.
