Application is now open for the next intake of participants for **Pathways**. The programme, which explores faith and ministry and is run by the Archdiocese, begins this year on Thursday, September 29, in DCU St Patrick's Campus. Pathways is a two-year, one evening a week course, for adults of all ages who wish to explore their faith. It runs from late September to May each year, with breaks for Christmas, Easter and mid-terms. There are no exams and no written work. The only requirement is an openness to listening to others and to participate. The cost is €400 per year which may be paid in instalments throughout the year. Reflection: I remember a theology lecturer saying to us many years ago in the seminary that God 'is not incomprehensible but infinitely comprehensible'. Today's feast of the Holy Trinity reminds us that if God is indeed mystery, and we can never fully grasp that mystery with our finite understanding, nevertheless God chooses to reveal himself to us in many ways, and particularly as Trinity. 'No man is an Island', the poet John Donne once wrote. The same it appears can be said of the Trinity. God is a dynamic communion of love of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and we are called to share in that communion and to reflect it in our relationships with others. We are made for relationship, for community. It is in and through our relationships with others that we grow as human beings and discover our giftedness, our call in life and the demands of love. That is true of family life and it is also what a parish is called to be: a community of faith and of loving service to others. Through the intimacy of prayer, Jesus grew to know God as 'Father'. May we take time each day, even if only for a few moments, to pray, so that we grow to know the living God and reflect God's love to others.
