All parish ministers, volunteers and staff should attend a Child Safeguarding Information session presented by the diocesan Training Officer, Garry Kehoe, every three years.

The report on our recent Building Hope parish gathering was submitted to the diocese and will also be posted at the back of the church and on our parish website.

Reflection: 'The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him in pairs...' This week, many primary school pupils are preparing to move on to secondary school, while older students are preparing for the transition to third level, travel or the world of work. Being 'sent out' is a common biblical theme, beginning with Abraham, or perhaps even earlier with Adam and Eve! Moses is called to lead his people out of Egypt. Jesus leaves his home town of Nazareth and a secure job in order to take up a ministry of preaching and healing in the towns and villages around the Sea of Galilee. In each case, it is about leaving behind what is safe, comfortable and familiar in order to embrace the uncertainty but opportunity of something new. Fundamental to our call as diocesan priests is the willingness to move parish after a number of years. It is never easy, as the more you get to know a community and build relationships, the harder it is to move on, but it is a good thing to do: both for the priest and for the parish! How we embrace new situations and challenges is important. As this Sunday's Gospel makes clear, our basic call as people of faith is to announce the kingdom or reign of God, and we do this above all through our attitudes, our openness to others, especially those who are different to us. Whether meeting new people while away on holiday or going into a new work situation, the openness we bring makes possible a deeper encounter: 'Whatever house you go into, let your first words be,
